Did You Know...?

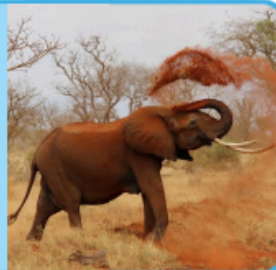
A group of elephants is called a herd.

Did You Know...?

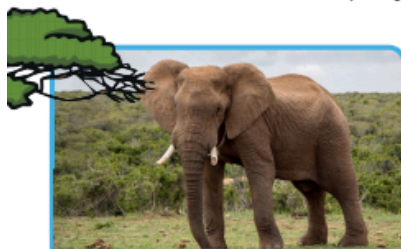
Elephants can get sunburnt because they do not have any fur to keep their skin safe.

They have a bath in the mud and throw dirt on themselves to help to protect their skin

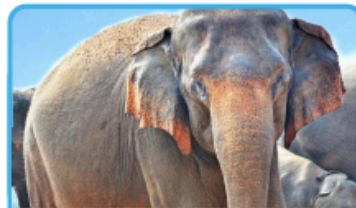


Telling Them Apart

There are three simple ways to tell whether the elephant you are looking at is an African elephant or an Asian elephant. You can look at their ears, the shape of their head and their tusks.



an African elephant



an Asian elephant

African elephants have large ears that look like the shape of Africa. Asian elephants have smaller, rounder ears.

African elephants have rounded heads. An Asian elephant's head looks like there are two hills on the top.

Both male and female African elephants can grow tusks. Only male Asian elephants can grow tusks.

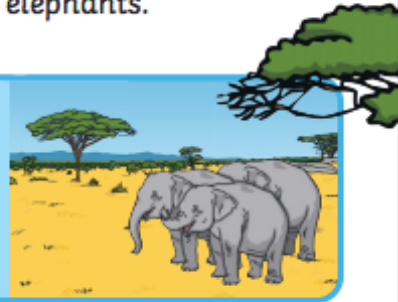
You may also look at the size of the elephant. African elephants are often bigger and heavier than Asian elephants.
