




### My child is happy at school



### My child feels safe at school




## The school makes sure children behave well




#### The school deals with bullying




# The school makes me aware of what my child is learning










How did the school do during the pandemic? What we did well -

Amazingly. I understand some parents (and my own) frustration at repeated bubble closures, but under the circumstances it is the safest option whilst following government guidelines. I genuinely admire all the teachers efforts, everyone has come together and always managed to stay positive even whilst I'm sure it has been more than frustrating and devastating at times.

The response to the pandemic has been excellent - quick and effective communication to parents; quality online teaching and learning and good catch-up strategies in place. Children's wellbeing has been at the heart of the approach throughout. The check-in-and-chat sessions during lockdown, where children could chat to their friends, were a

lovely touch and the book-led approach to wellbeing and dealing with different emotions is excellent.

The school has responded very well. In fact, the teachers have been too readily available during the mornings, evenings and weekends. They have gone over and above their call of duty and I think the teachers need to have protected time for their health and well-being where at certain times they should not be obligated to respond to messages and post messages. They too have a family to spend time with.

What we could do better -

Overall I have been pleased with the approach to the pandemic and the resources that have been made available to those at home. We have appreciated your efforts in trying to educate the members of our school who have continued to not follow covid guidelines. My only request would be that home learning sessions start quicker as the website work isn't up to date with the topics they are on. For example if a bubble closes by 12pm then home learning could start the next day as there is an afternoon to plan, even if it isn't the full lessons just something which was more specific to what they were actually learning in class.

Our response – The website's 15 daily plans are designed to be a 'recap and return to' set of activities and they are extensive in their size and there is a multitude of online resources such as Bug Club, Reading Plus, Maths Flex, and other links on our website. Once a bubble closed it was very difficult to start online learning straight away as staff had to pack resources, organise work packs or books for a range of children, go home themselves and then plan for online learning. It was just unmanageable to start online learning quickly and effectively. We followed guidance from Bolton to ensure that we start online 'live' learning a full school day after the bubble closure. So if we sent children home on a Monday at 10am, we would start 'live' learning on Wednesday as all other Bolton schools.
