Fingernail Polish or Make-Up

Pupils are not allowed to wear fingernail polish or false nails. Make-up is not allowed.

Jewellery/Accessories

Pupils may wear a watch (with no sound effects, cameras or games) and may wear one pair of small, stud earrings which must be worn in the lower ear lobe. All studs must be removed for PE by the pupil or taken out at home. Studs earrings that cannot be removed by the pupil for PE lessons will be covered with a plaster or tape.



Physical Education Kit



P.E. kits have to be worn by children all day on P.E. days. PE days will be twice per week. Children in Reception will not require to wear PE in Autumn term and this will be phased in form the Spring Term.

Footwear

Pupils must wear closed-toed, hard-soled, all black plain shoes with a flat sole. Footwear with flashing lights are strongly discouraged. Boots are not allowed. Open-toed sandals should not be worn, even in the Summer Term. In the case of extreme weather children can wear boots to school but must change into a pair of shoes on arrival to school.

Pupils can wear fully black trainers or black plimsolls for outdoor PE lessons. Barefoot work is undertaken for indoor gymnastic and dance lessons.

For Reception pupils, parents are kindly asked to buy shoes without laces.



Pupils' hair should be neatly groomed and tidy at all times. Long hair on both girls and boys should be tied back neatly. Pupils may not wear designs or words cut into their hair or permanent or temporary coloured hair. Small, emerald green hair bows and headbands are permitted. Other bright and oversized hair accessories are not permitted.

We are asking for donations of any amount to help us support our wonderful school. Anything you donate will be greatly appreciated and will most definitely help us on our way


to achieving our school goal.
