




#### Free School Meals

Free School Meals are an income related benefit, if you qualify your child would be entitled to a receive a free school meal during term time, and currently, an equivalent food voucher during the school holi days.



In addition to this, as a school, we receive additional pupil premium funding from the government to invest in your child, their learning and Are you entitled? experiences. This could include: Extra one-to-one or small-group sup-

port for children within the classroom; Employing extra teaching assistants to work with classes; providing extra tuition for able children who receive the pupil premium, for example in preparation for Year 6 SATs; Supporting music lessons, drama lessons, singing lessons etc... for children whose families would be unable to pay for them.. Contributing towards extra-curricular clubs such as Minecraft club, Judo, gymnastics etc...; Funding educational trips and visits if needed · Investing in resources that boost children's learning, such as laptops or tablets.

We are asking that even if your child is in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2 and therefore receives the Universal Free School Meals as part of a different government scheme, that you check if they
