

Our Reception class received a delivery of living eggs this week of caterpillars and chickens! It has been very exciting, and not just for Reception children but the whole school and staff.


The eggs were looked after in an incubator until they were ready to hatch. We were then treated to them hatching and are now enjoying looking after them now.

Some children had the opportunity to do the experiment themselves, and our scientist even got Mr Mcloughlin up to take part with the Magic Cup Trick!


Everyone had such fun and each child was given a bag of treats to take home with them.

Year 6 SATS are fast approaching, and it is important for the children to not only be prepared to apply their knowledge in their tests, but also that mentally they have the best possible mindset, and this is where you can help.

- Revision make sure that your child is given the time, space and support they require at home to complete their revision.
- Talk to your child and make sure they feel they are fully prepared and work with them if they feel they have any gaps in their learning. If you are unsure about anything speak to Miss Ruscoe.
- Try and ensure you don't make it a big deal. Make no mistake, SATs are important. They help prepare your child for the more formal teaching and more frequent testing of secondary school. They may also be used by your child's next school to decide which sets your child will be in and they can help build or break your child's confidence. Your child will be aware of how important they are, so make sure that at home you create a relaxed atmosphere around the subject of SATs.
- Make sure that your child is well rested and not having any late nights in the run up and during the exams - feeling tired restricts your memory retention and application of learning.
- Make sure they are at school in plenty of time THEY CANNOT BE LATE.
   Being late not only causes stress for your child, but can also disturb the rest of the class before or during the exam, and that is not fair.
- Make sure they have eaten a good nutritious breakfast too!
- Most of all, tell them you are proud of them and encourage to be the best that they can be!

#### Safeguarding

Safeguarding in schools is essential to keep children safe and ensure that we uphold our duty of care. At Beaumont we strive to ensure that all our children remain safe and free from harm. There are many ways in which we ensure that this happens from compliance with local and national policies, child protection, online safety, safer recruitment, safeguarding checks, health and safety, first aid, managing medical conditions and wellbeing.


So far this year, all our staff and governors have read and understood the Keeping Children Safe in Education Policy, received safeguarding training, completed online safety training and are fully active in the multi-Agency response to Child Protection concerns. Mr Bowden, our Site Manager has completed asbestos awareness and working at heights. And three members of staff have received Paediatric First Aid training – Mrs Lloyd, Mrs Hunter and Mrs Toone.

#### Signing in



The signing in system we introduced in September, InVentry, is working really well for those children that come into school late. However, some of our children are signing themselves out instead of in, they are unsure why they are late or are not signing themselves in at all.

From now on parents and carers must sign their children in on the InVentry system and not the children.

#### **Uniform Policy**

Children must come to school in their full uniform - on PE days they can arrive in school in their PE kit and trainers, and on non-PE days they must be wearing their school uniform and school shoes.

Our uniform policy reflects our values and reinforces our school's culture of high expectations and academic achievement. All pupils must dress according to the uniform policy. Our school uniform is important to us. It is one way in which we identify ourselves as a school community and it promotes a strong, cohesive identity which supports high standards and expectations in all areas of school life. It promotes harmony between different groups represented in the school, and it enhances security. Smartness and high standards of appearance are expected at all times.

#### Attendance Matters



#### Impact of absence:

We know that good attendance is a key factor in helping to ensure that children make excellent progress and fulfil their potential. To maximise your child's potential, they need to attend school every day.

Days off school soon add up and being absent from school makes it hard to avoid gaps in your child's learning, and results in them having to work harder when they return to catch up on their missed learning. Sometimes absence can't be helped - most children will be ill during the course of the year, require emergency appointments or have appointments that can't be moved to outside of school hours, however, there are 175 non-schools days a year for holidays, appointments, cultural experiences and family time.



#### **Unauthorised Absence Fines:**

Requesting leave of absence for your child(ren) may result in receiving a fine from our Local Authority, Bolton Council.

Bolton Council's criteria for issuing penalty notices and fines will be considered where a pupil has had 10 half day sessions, equivalent of 5 days (consecutive or otherwise), of unauthorised absence over the period of two consecutive half terms. The reason for this criteria is because:

- Headteachers need to strengthen sanctions for unnecessary absence from school.
- Increasing numbers of pupils are being classed as persistently absent.
- There is a significant increase in the amount of absence due to holidays in term time.

The Local Authority issue a fine of £60.00 per child for each adult living at the child's address, to be paid within 21 days. This increases to £120.00 within 28 days.
